A note about fund-raising: Firelands FFA typically does not do so many fundraisers! We normally only do meat raffle, citrus sale, & strawberry sale!

Due to rising cost of citrus & strawberries, profit margin has been steadily shrinking. We need to transition to new/different ways to make money. The FFA Chapter typically has about \$40,000 in costs for Career Development Events, banquet, fair, trips, community services, classroom & other FFA costs!

As we work & discover new, better, and overall fewer fund-raisers, please understand we don't want to focus so much on fundraising! But our ever-growing chapter needs to figure out how to fund our needs.

The big plan includes transitioning away from citrus & moving toward the tack swap or other short-term, high income activities.

Thank you for understanding and for helping as we get this figured out. We never want to charge an FFA member for Career Development Events, transportation, & most other involvement in FFA activities, so solving our fundraising problems is paramount.

This is an event that has been held since last year. These workshops boost leadership and promote involvement into the FFA. You need full official dress and need to be able to stay later than the school day in order to be eligible. The event officially starts at 9am on February 29th and will end at 5pm the same day. It is a \$30 entrance fee for Firelands attendees and will be split between Freshman/Sophomore and Junior/Senior between the two gyms here at the school. There will be approximately 15 schools joining us for the conference & spots are limited to 200 per session.

Any youth exhibiting AND housing an animal at the Lorain County Jr. Fair is REQUIRED to complete a form of the Assuring Quality Care of Animals (AQCA) program. The deadline to meet this requirement is JUNE 1ST. The options to complete this include registering for and attending an in-person simulation on one of the following dates:

- Monday, February 19 10:00am.-12:00p.m. & 1:00-3:00p.m. at the Lorain County fairgrounds
- Wednesday, April 17 1:00-6:00 p.m. for youth on a Winning 4-H Plan
- Thursday, April 18 6:00-8:00 p.m. for 1st year animal project members ONLY
- Tuesday, March 19 6-8 at the Medina County fairgrounds
- Tuesday, May 7 6:00 8:00 at the Lorain County fairgrounds
- Tuesday, May 14 6-8 at the Medina County fairgrounds
